- HB 3** Oppose motion to adopt the conference committee report on public school finance (RV #1941); signed by Gov.
- HB 10** Oppose passage creating a Mental and Behavioral Health Research Institute (RV #366); left in Senate Intent Committee.
- HB 16** Support the motion to concur with the Senate amendments on Born Alive Infant Protection Act (RV #1727); signed by Gov.

HB 1070 Oppose passage of mental health first aid training requirements (RV #364); signed by Gov.

HB 1313 Support passage of property tax reform (RV #1961); signed by Gov.

HB 1342 Support passage relating to a nonviolent criminal's record eligibility for an occupational license (RV #1342); signed by Gov.

HB 1343 Support the motion to concur with the Senate amendments making it a criminal offense to have improper contact with a victim (RV #1740); signed by Gov.

HB 1631 Support passage of eliminating red light cameras (RV #1131); signed by Gov.

HB 1802 Support passage relating to filing a request for arbitration of certain appraisal review board orders (RV #392); signed by Gov.

HB 2100 Support passage of protecting free speech on college campuses (RV #800); signed by Gov.
